Tylenol Scholarship

The Tylenol Scholarship program is designed to assist students pursuing careers in the healthcare, life sciences or related fields to manage the rising costs of education. Tylenol will award a total of \$250,000 scholarships to applicants with combined leadership and academic excellence. Ten grand prize winners will receive \$10,000 each, while thirty winners will earn \$5,000 grants. Eligible candidates must be pursuing healthcare-related education at an accredited institution. The application deadline is typically in mid-May.

The Gates Millennium Scholars

GMS will select 1,000 talented students each year to receive a good-through-graduation scholarship to use at any college or university of their choice. We provide Gates Millennium Scholars with personal and professional development through our leadership programs along with academic support throughout their college career. Students are **eligible** to be considered for a GMS scholarship if they meet all of the following criteria:

- Are African American, American Indian/Alaska Native*, Asian Pacific Islander American** or Hispanic American
- Are a citizen, national or legal permanent resident of the United States
- Have attained a cumulative high school GPA of 3.3 on an unweighted 4.0 scale or have earned a GED
- Will enroll for the first time at a U.S. located, accredited*** college or university (with the exception of students concurrently pursuing a high school diploma) in the fall of 2012 as a full-time, degree-seeking, first-year student. First-time college enrollees can also be GED recipients.
- Have demonstrated leadership abilities through participation in community service, extracurricular, or other activities
- Meet the Federal Pell Grant eligibility criteria
- Have completed and submitted all three required forms: the student's application (Nominee Personal Information Form), an evaluation of the student's academic record (Nominator Form) and an evaluation of the student's community service and leadership activities (Recommender Form) by the deadline

Mary Free Bed Minority Scholarship Program

An individual is eligible to apply for a one-year scholarship for education-related expenses if he or she meets the established criteria. The scholarship amounts will vary depending on individual needs.

Criteria:

- Currently enrolled in, or accepted in, an accredited college or university as a full-time, degree-seeking student in nursing or therapy program (PT, OT, speech)
- Cumulative college GPA or 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale (overall and chosen area of study)
- Demonstrates leadership abilities through participation in community service, extracurricular activities, or volunteer involvement
- Black or African American, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Asian, Hispanic or Latino, Native Hawaiian, or other Pacific Islander

Portage Hospital Auxiliary Scholarship

ASRT Education and Research Foundation Entry-Level Scholarship

Occupational/Physical Therapy Scholarship

Awarded to students who are in financial need and have been accepted or are attending an accredited school of occupation therapy (including art, music or physical therapy).

Scholarships for Clinical Laboratory Students

The purpose of these scholarships is to help defray education costs, promote medical laboratory science as a rewarding career, and to help address the workforce shortage of qualified professionals.

Cooley Scholarship, Masters Scholarship (American Association of Health Education)

The award is open to a master's level student who is currently enrolled in a health education program at an accredited college/university in the United States or a U.S. Territory. To be eligible, the applicant must have a minimum current overall grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Prior AAHE scholarship recipients are not eligible. This award is a \$1,000 scholarship, which recipients may spend in any manner they desire. The completed application form must be received by November 15 of each year.

Bill Kane Scholarship, Undergraduate Scholarship (American Association of Health Education)

This award is a \$1,000 scholarship awarded annually to an undergraduate health education major at an accredited college/university in the United States or a U.S. territory. To be eligible, the applicant must be currently enrolled full-time at a college or university for both the fall and spring semesters of the academic year during which the student is applying. The student must have sophomore, junior or senior status at the time of application. Must have a minimum, current overall grade point average of 3.25 on a 4.0 scale at the AAHE application deadline, which is November 15. Prior award recipients may not apply.

In order to apply for scholarship awards, applicants must be a member of the American Art Therapy association. Awards are granted only to active *student members of the Association and those who have been accepted or are attending an American Art Therapy Association approved Graduate Art Therapy Program. *One award (Pearlie Roberson Award) is open to both Student and Professional Member Applicants. Deadline: May 1, 2012 – incomplete applications packets and those postmarked or emailed after May 1, 2012 will not be considered. Scholarships range from 4900 up to \$2,000 depending on the annual budget.

American Medical Technologists Scholarships

For all students, except those preparing for an R.N. degree, application must be for at least the third year of college. R.N. students must have completed the first year of schooling. Pre-med students are not eligible to apply. There is no age limit. Scholarships are for \$1,000.
